

Incident Management Plan

Water Incident

1. Contact Coastguard by VHF channel 16 / 67 / mobile phone.
2. Maintain contact with Club VHF/mobile phone.
3. In case of a problem use above to ensure all are aware of present status of competitors.
4. Maintain 360° lookout and direct safety craft as required.
5. Maintain written records of actions taken, if there is a fatality or serious injury
Police/Coroner will be assessing if a crime has been committed due to lack of duty of care which the Club may have.
6. People are not deemed safe until they are all on land.
7. Skipper of a boat or person in charge should stay in the vicinity of an incident until it is resolved and all competitors are accounted for.

Land Emergency

1. Medical Kit in Club Operations Room. Defibrillator on wall outside FSC.
2. First Aider in Club.
3. Safeguarding incident. DBS personnel available. Report to staff in Race Office. See Flag Officer at Club. Find responsible adult for person involved.
4. Contact emergency services and ensure access to available landing place is available possible Water Sport Centre.

A club member to coordinate the situation on land

1. S/he maintains VHF/mobile phone contact with person afloat or directly if ashore with regard to up to date position of those involved.
2. Keeps a record of people/resources sent to assist.
3. Sets up a control centre free from disturbance to control the incident.
4. Sets up an emergency team
 - 1 person to collate personnel/boat status
 - 1 person to deal with members/competitors/relatives/press.
 - 1 person to liaise with Police if necessary
 - 1 person to maintain written records of actions taken
